### Unopen Flower



Some of these example are borderline, where the flower is beginning or about to open. The anthers are not visible and the petals are mostly closed, so it is stil an unopened flower.

## Open Flower



In some examples (second photo) the petals and spur are mangled and could be mistaken for a senesced flower. Note the presence of attached petals.

## Senesced Flower



The last example for senesced flower is almost borderline fruiting, but the petals and anthers are still attached, so it is still being considered a senesced flower.

## Fruit



The last example is just borderline a fruit, because it is missing all petals and anthers.
